## THE HOLY SEASON OF ADVENT

Historically in the Roman Catholic Church, the primary sanctuary color of Advent is *Purple*, which symbolizes penitence and fasting. Purple is also the color associated with royalty, which is fitting as we await the birth of Christ the King. We also use purple during the season of Lent and Holy Week, thus demonstrating the inseparable link between the birth and death of Jesus Christ. The joy of the Christmas Season is tempered by the knowledge that Advent, the beginning of the Liturgical year, is also a time for penitence and fasting.

The Office of Safe Environment for Children, Youth and Adults is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the diocese is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

<u>CAP 1</u> teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees

<u>CAP 2</u> is No More Bullies, No More Victims and is a workshop on bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyberbullying is also addressed. Both sessions are 90 minutes.

Adults must attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2. After five years, adults can opt to attend CAP 1 again if they prefer or CAP 2.




