The Mass setting chosen for this wonderful day will be the *Missa Dolorosa*, by Antonio Caldara (c. 1670-1736), a composer of the Baroque era. Our Cantor, Mr. Nicholas Beck, a graduate of Westminster Choir College will direct the singing of the Gregorian Propers and Dr. Timothy McDonnell will be the conductor of the Mass.
