20/20 Vision:

A Campaign to FOCUS on protecting babies in the womb



Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Lindenwold will host a gathering on **Thursday, June 8, at 7 p.m.** for anyone interested in learning of a new initiative that highlights the humanity of the unborn. It is called the **20/20 Project**, and it has legislative, educational and spiritual components, with a goal to ban abortions after 20 weeks by the year 2020 as a first step in ending abortion. This project has been received well in the northern part of the state, but has not been introduced in the Camden Diocese yet.

Christine Flaherty of LIFENET will be the guest speaker. Flaherty, who works out of the Newark Archdiocesan Center, has worked to mobilize people from a variety of churches, respect life organizations, and faith-based groups, such as the Knights of Columbus, the Archdiocese of Newark and Diocese of Metuchen, and New Jersey Right to Life, to focus on this common goal. The effort is grounded in prayer, with more than 1,000 Masses to be said this year for the protection of babies in the womb and their families.
